


STUDENTS FOR GUN FREE SCHOOLS

CAMPUS LEADER GUIDELINES



Thank you for your interest in becoming a Campus Leader with [Students for Gun Free Schools \(SGFS\)](#). America's universities and colleges should be allowed to set policies regarding firearms on campus without interference from state legislatures (and the gun lobby), and your support for your school is critical.

There are two basic requirements for SGFS Campus Leaders:

- 1) We ask that you join the [Students for Gun Free Schools Facebook Group](#) and invite 10 or more of your friends to join.
- 2) We ask that you be willing to speak to the media on behalf of Students for Gun Free Schools when a reporter seeks comment from someone on your campus/in your state. In order to serve in this role effectively, you must be familiar with the two key SGFS documents: "[Why Our Campuses are Safer without Concealed Handguns](#)" and "[How We Can Prevent Future Tragedies](#)." You should also research your state's gun laws through the [Legal Community Against Violence's State & Local Laws web tool](#). Remember that your comments to the media should reflect SGFS's official positions on issues, and not your personal views.

Campus Leaders are also encouraged (but not required) to engage in the following activities:

- Meeting with state legislators to indicate SGFS' opposition to bills that would force universities and colleges to allow students and faculty to carry concealed handguns on their campuses.
- Educating students on your campus about this issue by hosting discussions, debates, guest speakers.
- Writing letters to the editor and Op-Ed pieces for your school newspaper and local periodicals.
- Organizing peaceful demonstrations to call for tougher laws to keep guns out of the hands of criminals, domestic abusers, drug addicts, children, and the mentally ill.
